(It's not just the algorithms that look at your information. Some random guy that works at some random company might decide to take a look. He could be a stalker, or a vigilante. Maybe he'll sell your information on the black market.)



But so what if Instagram knows where you live? Remember when we said that they don't just sell ads, they also sell your personal information? Once Instagram learns it, they tell other companies, who tell tell other companies, who tell even more people, including the government. Governments have used data from social media to track data from social media dissent.

What the algorithm learns about you, and your behavior, is being used to sell ads. So what if your ads are more relevant?

The purpose of advertising is to influence you. It's propaganda for a brand. The better the algorithm understands you, the better it can manipulate you; and the rest of society.



These algorithms have been used to influence politics around the world. Whether to sell products or political ideologies: their goal is to manipulate you and control who you are


At a certain point, are they selling you the things you like? Or are your beliefs and interests entirely just shaped by whatever they sell you?

Say you let Instagram access your location. Now they know where you live, where you spend your time. From what it knows about your city, school, family, income, interests, life path, sexual orientation, health, gender, sexual orientation, health, gender, sexual history, political views, who your best friend is, and wore it knows the friend is, and wore it knows the better if

Meanwhile, an algorithm (a computer program) is looking at everything they know and trying to figure out what assumptions can be made about you. The algorithm is only guessing, but it's good at guessing, fou'd be surprised how much about you can be learned from just a small amount of information.

So what can you do? Is your only option to have no friends and go live in a cave? Of course not. Issue #2 will show you how to take back your privacy and autonomy, without going off the grid.
