We provide professional development on topics like privacy basics, understanding artificial intelligence, and intellectual freedom defense.



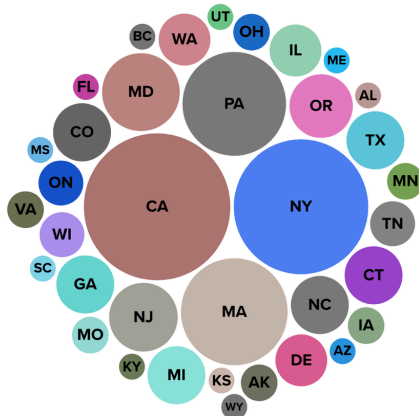
We create community spaces for library workers to collaborate, strategize, learn, and build community.
